Sustainability Aspects of This Event:

Conference organizers and the Sheraton Hotel have taken the following steps to make this event more sustainable. Hotel within walking distance of mass transit and specified in directions package as the preferred mode of arrival. Hotel has towel and linen program that allows participating guests to help conserve water and energy. Conference handouts printed two slides per page and double-sided. Breakfast, lunch, and snack breaks incorporate reduced packaging by using bulk sugar, jellies, bowls of mayo and mustard for lunch, pitchers of juices for breakfast rather than individually packaged servings. Sandwiches served on platters instead of boxes, with cloth napkins and metal flatware -- no disposable items used. Soft drinks individually canned but recycling bins placed nearby.
